## Reaping the awards...

Autumn is awards season for the interiors industry, with two major events showcasing the latest and greatest: the Interior Design Awards (IDA) and the Dulux Colour Awards. The Ross Street Residence, above, designed by Victorian architectural firm Hassell, won the Residential Interior Design category at the IDA. Meanwhile, Beach House, on Sydney's North Shore, designed by Hare & Klein, took out the gong for the Residential Interior Decoration category.



### Fresh angles

This dramatic exterior scooped up the Residential Exterior category of the Dulux awards. The Klein Bottle house, designed by McBride Charles Ryan, uses a combination of Dulux Elephant, Antique White, Pear Ash, Red Clown, Spanish Olive and Black. "Reflectivity allowed the same colour to be read in many ways through this design," said the judges. Among the entries, they saw a trend towards using colour to highlight architectural features. ▶
