The judging process, which conforms to international standards, confers awards of both national and international significance. Jurors are eminent designers working with a convener appointed by the Design Institute of Australia. Judging is conducted under the auspices of the Design Institute of Australia, and observes the protocols set by the International Federation of Interior Architects/Interior Designers, of which the DIA (Design Institute of Australia - the professional body representing Australian designers) is a member organisation.

Entrants receive incredible media recognition in a range of newspapers, magazines and websites. Any Australian-based design professional can enter.

The Winner of The Emerging Practice Award was Matt Gibson of A + D, with the projects Clifton Hill Residence, Toorak Residence, Richmond Residence. Finalist, Architects Eal, was recognised for their entries Kelso House, Walter's Apartment and Cha Restaurant, and David Hicks for Calibre, Melbourne Central, Parlour Restaurant, Calibre Bondi Junction.
